

Some fun ways to study spelling words at home!

Write a note to mom or dad, grandparent or sibling, using your spelling words.

Go on a word hunt. Write your words on slips of paper. Give the slips to a family member and have them hide them. Then go hunt for your words!

Write a poem or a song using your words.

Write your words on graph paper using one square for each letter. Trace around the words with a marker.

Write each word in a silly sentence or riddle.

Write your words from longest to shortest.

Sort your words by syllables. Write them in columns.

Write a story using all your words.

Type your words on the computer. You can even email them to Mrs. Davis (davisthe@stagneskc.org)!

Play memory with your words. Write each word twice, once per index card. Shuffle the cards and lay them upside down. Try to pick up the matching words.

Draw a comic strip with pictures and add spelling words in speech bubbles.

Write each of your words. Write the consonants in blue and the vowels in red.

Write a question sentence using each word. (You could try to answer each question using another spelling word.)

Write your word in crayon. Go over it in another color crayon. Go over it again in another color crayon! We call this rainbow spelling!

Use alphabet stickers, stamps, or glitter glue to write each word.

Find your words in the dictionary. Write the definition.

Write your words twice with your right hand and once with your left hand (or the other way around if you are left handed)!

Pyramid write your words.

Example: cloud

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Draw a picture of your words.

Snap and clap your spelling words. Say the word aloud clapping for each consonant and snapping for each vowel as you say the letters.

Example: cloud clap, clap, snap, snap, clap

Pour some salt on a cookie sheet, and write your spelling words in the salt. You could also use fine sand or shaving cream!

Put paint or pudding in a Ziploc gallon bag. Double bag it! Write spelling words in the paint or pudding.
