## Liturgy of the Day

Sisters and brothers, we have come today at God's invitation to be nourished by Word and Eucharist. The word that we hear today is a challenge: All our possessions, all our achievements amount to nothing unless we become rich in what matters to God. As we listen to God's Word today let us prayerfully ponder the question of what it is that matters to God. Then let us joyfully respond by putting on the "new self" of which Saint Paul writes.

Let us allow this challenging word of God to penetrate and change our hearts. For this kind of change, we rely on the power of the Holy Spirit who is present in this holy place.

## Things To Remember If You Are Hospitalized

1. As you are being admitted, tell them you are Catholic (whether they ask or not.) Tell them you want to receive Holy Communion
2. If no Eucharistic Minister comes within a day or two, tell your nurse you want to receive, OR, ask a family member to call Spiritual Wellness to make sure you are on the Catholic list.
3. However, if you know in advance you will be hospitalized, call the rectory to schedule an anointing with Fr. Jerry.

Above all –Let us know where you are!

\*Only immediate family member may request someone's name to be placed on the prayer list.
